Parliament passes CEC, telecom, criminal Bills

Three more MPs suspended on the day both Houses adjourned sine die

New Delhi, 21 December

The Winter Session of Parliament, the penultimate session of the 17th Lok Sabha, ended a day ahead of schedule on Thursday with the two Houses passing half a dozen Bills on the last day in the absence of most of the Opposition members.

In the Lok Sabha, three more Opposition MPs – Congress' Nakul Nath, Deepak Bajaj and DK Suresh – were suspended, taking the total number of such suspensions to 100. During the session, an unprecedented 146 MPs were suspended in the two Houses for "unruly conduct" as they demanded that Union Home Minister Amit Shah make a statement in Parliament on the December 13 security breach. Earlier in the session, the Lok Sabha expelled Trinamool Congress' Mahua Moitra.

The INDIA bloc MPs on Thursday marched from Parliament to Vijay Chowk, with banners and placards that said 'Save Democracy', 'Parliament Caged' and 'Democracy Expelled' to protest the suspensions.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said Prime Minister Narendra Modi had violated parliamentary privilege by not speaking on the security breach issue inside the House.

"He (Modi) talks in Varanasi, Ahmedabad, on TV but not in Parliament. They have disrespected the House. He should come and speak in the House first, Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha. Instead of that he was speaking outside. This is condemnable and it was a violation of privilege (of the House)," Kharge said.

In a reference to the mimicry issue and Rajya Sabha Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar's remarks on it, Kharge said, "I am sorry to say that the Rajya Sabha Chairman has in a way brought casteism to Parliament by raising an

issue." In his remarks at the end of the session, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla said the House held 14 sittings since December 4, worked for 61 hours and 50 minutes, recording productivity of 74 per cent, and passed 18 Bills.

In the Rajya Sabha, Dhankhar said 17 Bills were passed during 65 hours of working with 79 per cent productivity.

On the last day of the session, the Rajya Sabha passed three Bills to replace colonial-era criminal laws,

which the Lok Sabha had passed on Wednesday. Parliament also passed the Telecom Bill and a Bill to put in place a mechanism to appoint the Chief Election Commissioners and Election Commissioners.

The Lok Sabha passed the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) and Other Election Commissioners (ECs) (Appointment, Conditions of Service and Term of Office) Bill earlier this week.

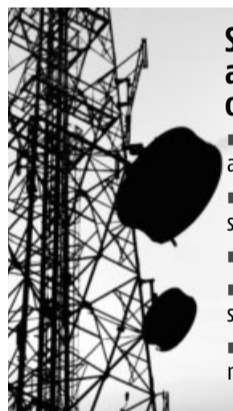
From crime prevention to flight services: Telecom Bill expedites process

New Delhi, 21 December

The Department of Telecommunication (DoT) will now be able to better process requests for spectrum allotment from a long list of government agencies as the Telecom Bill has specified the sectoral uses for which such allocation is allowed, officials said on Thursday.

Apart from satellite communication, 18 other sectors from law enforcement and crime prevention to in-flight and maritime connectivity have been listed in the First Schedule of the Bill where administrative allocation will be mandatorily made. In many of these areas, there was no clear process for allocating spectrum, which often led to a lengthy application and evaluation process and disputes.

The Bill has also specified the government may amend the First Schedule to 'perform government functions' or 'serve public interest' or in cases where auction of spectrum is not the preferred mode of assignment due to technical or economic rea-

sons.

Officials said the Bill has provided a clear legal basis for spectrum allocation, which till now was allocated or auctioned by the government based on the interpretation of various laws and judgements. It has now been clearly laid out that spectrum will be auctioned, except for defined items in the First Schedule, ending the discretionary approach.

"We would now be able to clear requests from many users, and especially government ministries and agencies expeditiously," an official said.

Currently, spectrum has

already been allocated by the government administratively in 4,700 instances. However, it has always been provided on an 'ad-hoc' basis.

NFAP review

To ease the process further, the government is expected to bring out a revamped National Frequency Allocation Plan as well, sources said. The NFAP is a central policy that defines the roadmap for future spectrum usage by all national authorities, including the telecom and space departments and information and broadcasting and defence ministries.

CISF to take over House security from police

The government has decided to hand over "comprehensive" security of the Parliament building complex to the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) in the wake of the recent breach of the safety ring, official sources said Thursday.

The CISF will render access control to the new and old Parliament complex in an airport security-like fashion where body frisking of persons will be done through hand-held detectors and their belongings will be checked through X-ray machines, with provision to even scan shoes, heavy jackets and belts by putting them on a tray and passing them through the scanner, the sources said.

Earlier, frisking of visitors to Parliament complex was done by Delhi Police personnel. In a major security breach on the anniversary of the 2001 Parliament terror attack on December 13, two persons jumped into the Lok Sabha chamber from the public gallery during Zero Hour, released yellow smoke from canisters.

164 planes lying idle at 15 airports: Govt

As many as 164 planes are lying idle at 15 airports in the country, the government said on Thursday. Most of the aircraft are grounded due to Pratt & Whitney (P&W) engine issues and there are also planes of non-operational airlines, including Go First and Jet Airways. The P&W engine issues have significantly impacted the fleet of IndiGo, the country's largest airline. The highest number of grounded aircraft is at Delhi airport at 64.

India plans research station in Antarctica

India aims to set up a new research station in Antarctica near the Maitri station in the eastern part of the icy continent by 2029, Union Earth Sciences Minister Kiren Rijiju said on Thursday. In a written reply in the Rajya Sabha, Rijiju said the site for the new research station — Maitri-II — has been identified and a preliminary topographical survey for the approach road is underway. The existing Indian research station — Maitri — is very old, the minister said, adding that it is imperative to build a new research station. The proposed project envisages adherence to environmental protocols for Antarctica and improving the quality of Indian scientific research in the southernmost continent.

Handling solid waste: States fined ₹79K cr

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has imposed fines totalling ₹79,098 crore on states and Union territories for non-compliance with municipal solid waste management rules and other environmental violations in 2022-23, the government informed Parliament on Thursday.
